
Meet Stephanie Pierson

There, I started a casual conversation with a divorced man who had also just finished cancer treatment. He was a graphic artist and a photographer. Much to my surprise we had lovely chemistry and we began dating. I started to come alive again and notice all the beauty surrounding me. Art was a constant in ours days. He drew, painted and photographed. He nudged me into joining him in his artistic pursuits. He was a brilliant coach, and with his constant mentoring and advice, I started experimenting with collage.








Great, appreciate you sharing that with us. Before we ask you to share more of your insights, can you take a moment to introduce yourself and how you got to where you are today to our readers?

I kept at it. I visted galleries, read blogs about collage and talked to every art store manager in town regarding products. I felt so uncreative. So stuck. I kept cutting up magazines and playing with different glues. And my mentor kept nudging. After months of this ongoing challenge I glued some random pieces together and created an image that made my heart soar! I was so lost in that moment, no worries or concerns, I lost track of time, a natural high, I had found my style and my flow!







What do you think is the goal or mission that drives your creative journey?

I have had a variety of opportunities to show my art work in galleries and have sold many pieces, for which I am extremely grateful! Unfortunately life struck me down again...my sweet boyfriend/mentor died and breast cancer showed up again. I was shattered. After having a bilateral mastectomy, and accepting the fact that my boyfriend/mentor would no longer be there to nudge me and cheer for me, I shut down, again. I could not imagine creating art again. But all along I could hear his voice...nudging, encouraging, cheering. I knew I needed to collage again, to reconnect with the artist in me. I knew I needed to find my way back to the flow. And then it occured to me....I had become a collage, broken to pieces, cut up. I needed to find my way forward. I needed to glue myself back together in a new way, and not worry about the seams showing. I needed to slice, suture, reassemble!

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
